farmer professionalism. In 2013 he was ranked 6<sup>th</sup> in the TROUW (newspaper) top 100 most influential Dutch persons in Sustainability.

#### Stayokay Trip

## **Important dates**

The table below shows an overview of the various courses of the minor. There are three courses: *Big Issues New Answers* (BINA); *Designing Research for Sustainability Solutions*; and *Area Study on Sustainability*. The *Area Study on Sustainability* has three options: *Area Study Netherlands*, *Area Study Indonesia* and *Area Study Philippines*. The *Area Study Indonesia* and *Sustainability Philippines* have a limited number of places; more information about the selection procedure will follow in September.

BINA consists of four modules. Each module has an assessment in a format most suitable to the module (e.g. a report, presentation, debate, ...). In addition, there is one final exam of the whole BINA course.
